Training Providers can submit course application in TPGateway to obtain funding for your courses. Funding support will commence from the date that the course is approved. You will need to submit courses well ahead of course commencement, taking into consideration time needed for SSG to approve the funding. Please note that you are not allowed to market the courses prior to SSGs approval. A fee of \$109.00 (including GST) is payable online for each course application. After funding is approved, you can also set up the course runs in TPGateway so that the information will be listed in the Course Directory in MySkillsFuture for trainees to access the available courses. For first-time course application, you will also need to fulfil the Organisation Registration requirements and pay a registration fee. Note: SSG will stop funding Non-Certifiable Courses after 31 December 2024. Please note that SSG will stop accepting new submissions for Non-Certifiable Courses from 1 October 2022 onwards. For more details, please refer to the circular published here. What are the eligibility criteria for Non WSQ Certifiable Courses? Courses must fulfil all of the following criteria: Must be examinable and have clear learning outcomes; Meant for employment, job development or job upgrading purposes; Skills and competencies addressed by the course should meet industry skills shortage or manpower demand (i.e. applicants may not be supported if there is an excess supply of manpower/skills in the industry); Must not be academic degree courses, i.e. bachelor, master or doctorate degree courses; and Are required to meet SSGs Adult Educator Qualifications Requirements from 01 January 2021 onwards. Courses must also fulfil one of the following certification criteria: Lead to a qualification (below degree) awarded by a local post-secondary education institution under Singapore's education system, such as ITE Nitec or Polytechnic Diploma; or Be recognised under the regulatory or professional development framework endorsed by a Singapore Government agency for the sector, including mandatory skills-based training stipulated by the relevant Singapore Government agency for the sector. Note: SSG does not fund courses which are not meant for employment, job development or job upgrading purposes. You may refer to the following on the types of courses which will not be supported by SSG. Personal enrichment/ lifestyle courses, e.g. swimming, yoga, music, Class 2 and 3 driving, Company-specific courses, e.g. employee induction, orientation Academic degree courses, e.g. bachelor, master, doctorate degrees Seminars and conferences Overseas courses Courses which include contents that are objectionable on the grounds of public interest, national security, racial harmony, prohibited by applicable Singapore laws, or related to metaphysics, religion, deviant belief and any offensive topics likely to incite feelings of enmity, ill-will or hostility. What are the eligibility criteria for E-Learning courses? For E-learning courses, they must fulfil the following criteria on top of the fundamental criteria listed above: A) Criteria for conduct of e-learning in synchronous mode, i.e. via webinars and video conferencing E-learning course evaluation criteria: Demonstrate system capability to authenticate trainees' identities; Demonstrate system capability to validate attendance records & track trainees' progress; Trainer/instructor support must be available for trainee who need further clarification or assistance; and Technical helpdesk support must be available. B) Criteria for conduct of e-learning in asynchronous mode, i.e. trainees are learning at their own pace E-learning course evaluation criteria: Demonstrate system capability to authenticate trainees' identities; Demonstrate system capability to validate attendance records & track trainees' progress. Note: Administrator rights to Learning Management System (LMS) to be granted to SSG and to update SSG when there are changes to the LMS and/or LMS administrator rights; Trainer/instructor support must be available for trainee who need further clarification or assistance; and Technical helpdesk support must be available. For certifiable courses to be eligible for absentee payroll funding, the course must have a course commencement date, a course end date and state the minimum estimated number of learning hours expected to complete the course. An authentication process to verify trainee identity, enable the conduct of e-assessments and ensure accuracy and authenticity of the assessment results; and Instructor facilitation (conducted online without the need for such facilitation to be real-time or face-to-face) Courses, delivered in full online asynchronous learning mode, must either be certifiable or endorsed by a Singapore Government agency to be eligible for funding. The Training and Adult Education (TAE) Industry Transformation Map (ITM) was launched on 1 Feb 2018 and one of the thrusts was to improve the productivity of Training Providers through digital transformation. As part of sectoral transformation, it is of paramount importance to leverage enabling infrastructures to raise the productivity of the TAE sector. Training Management System (TMS) is therefore identified as a key enabler that will help Training Providers elevate business growth and be competitive in the digital economy. A TMS is a software that helps Training Providers to streamline and track multiple backend processes such as learners enrolment, resource scheduling, billing and collection so that administration work becomes more efficient. TMS Integration Requirement Training Providers that receive funding from SSG will require to use a TMS linked to SSG's system to facilitate data transfer to process training grants from 31 December 2021 onwards. Training Providers subjected to the TMS requirement are required to integrate their existing TMS or subscribe to a TMS that is already linked to SSG Systems by 31 December 2021 to avoid disruption to training grants. The requirement to use a TMS linked to SSG systems applies to all Training Providers who offer SSG approved funded courses EXCEPT for the following groups: Enterprises who are not offering training as a primary business but conduct in-house training to their own employees. These enterprises would rely on HR system to manage their employees training and development needs. Government Entities who are not offering training as a primary business but perform other functions such as community building. An example is SkillsFuture@PA courses offered by the Community Clubs. Overseas Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) providers who do not have a local office and are not registered with ACRA. Training Providers offering SkillsFuture Credit Only (SFC-only) courses supported by Ministry of Education (MOE)-funded institutions [1] and other public agencies, aside from SSG. [1] Institute of Technical Education, polytechnics, autonomous universities, LASALLE College of the Arts and Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts Benefits of a TMS Linked to SSG Systems A TMS would allow Training Providers to manage and track all courses and effectively manage the learners journey. Instead of storing course-related information on multiple files, a TMS becomes a central data depository for training administrators to find accurate and updated information easily. As information becomes digital, manual tasks such as sending course reminders and compiling enrollment data can be automated. Not only do TMS reduce administration workload and human error, it also helps Training Providers to have more resources to focus on their core business. Data analytics is also made possible with a TMS, where reports can be generated to make informed business decision. In addition to achieving better operational efficiency in managing training administration, data needed to facilitate SSG training claims processing will be transmitted from a linked-TMS to SSGs system seamlessly, without the need to manually prepare and perform duplication of data entry across multiple systems. TMS Options and Integration 1. For Training Providers with Existing TMS Training Providers with existing TMS can integrate with SSGs systems upon fulfilling SSGs IT security requirements. To subscribe to the necessary integrations to perform data transfer from TMS to SSGs systems, Training Providers can refer to the SSG Developer Portal () for more details. Training Providers should note that the integrations are dynamic and will change as SSG rolls out new schemes or revises existing schemes. To prevent disruption to your operations, Training Providers should work with your TMS vendors to ensure that your TMS integrations keep pace with changes to SSGs requirements. We encourage training providers to refer to the SSG Developer Portal regularly to keep abreast of the latest updates. 2.
